The Missions and Service Committee has been made aware of a woman here in Saskatoon, Fatima, who is looking for help in sponsoring her relatives to come to Canada as refugees. The family of five is currently in Pakistan, originally from Afghanistan, and she fears for their safety. The cost to bring her family to Saskatoon will be approximately \$63,000. Fatima indicated that she can put forward \$40,000 herself and is keen to help with additional fundraising.

The Missions and Service Committee is bringing this request forward to the congregation to see if there are individuals who are interested in teaming up for this refugee sponsorship project. MCC says this, "Sponsorship groups are essentially a team of at least five or more people who have the time, resources to help, and live in the same community, like a church or community group. While the sponsorship lasts only a year, the relationships built are often lifelong and transformational."

If there is sufficient interest, the process begins with the formation of a refugee committee and fundraising. Based on Fatima's commitment, the committee would need to raise \$23,000. Once the required funds are in place, we would be approved as sponsors and sign up. The next steps of bringing the family to Canada depend on politics, immigration and paperwork. This can typically take 1-3 years. Once a date for arrival is set, the committee would work to secure housing, and other settlement needs such as medical care, English classes, integration, etc.
